

The Alexandra Hospital

Introduction

Consultants are critical to each Circle Health Group hospital. In common with other private healthcare operators and in most instances, Circle Health Group does not employ these consultants. Instead, most consultants working in our hospitals are self-employed practitioners who see and treat patients at our hospitals under the terms of our “Practising Privileges” policy.

In 2014, the Competition and Markets Authority issued an Order (the “**CMA Order**”) regulating the relationships between private hospitals and consultants who have Practising Privileges or treat private patients or refer them for tests at private facilities (“**Referring Clinicians**”).

In accordance with the CMA Order, hospital operators are prohibited from offering any incentive scheme or arrangement, whether legally enforceable or not, or incentive, which is intended to induce or may be reasonably regarded as inducing Referring Clinicians to refer patients to, or treat private patients at, their facilities. Circle Health Group does not operate any such schemes. The Order also requires hospital operators to disclose information about certain arrangements they have with Referring Clinicians, including: ownership interests held by Referring Clinicians in the hospital operator or in equipment used in the hospital; the provision of certain “high value” services to Referring Clinicians; the availability of “low value” basic amenities for Referring Clinicians; and any remuneration for services provided by Referring Clinicians to the hospital. Set out below is information about the arrangements we have with Referring Clinicians at this hospital.

Higher Value Services

We charge our Referring Clinicians £26 per hour for using consulting rooms at our hospital, except in relation to NHS patients.

We charge our Referring Clinicians £30 per square metre per month for using space at our hospital for their own private medical secretaries.

Lower Value Services

We provide a number of support services to our Referring Clinicians, for which we do not make a charge. Further details regarding these arrangements are provided on our corporate webpage [here](#).

General Corporate Hospitality

At this hospital, we provide general corporate hospitality as detailed on our corporate webpage [here](#).

In addition to the arrangements detailed on our corporate webpage, the hospital holds an annual dinner for members of its Medical Advisory Committee, to which members' partners are also invited. The dinner approximately costs £2,000.

Financial Interests

Mr Yakubu Karagama, Consultant ENT Surgeon, owns an ENT Stack System which he uses at our hospital. The hospital pays £1,000 per month for use of the equipment.

Services Arrangements

Supportive Care (UK) Limited (of which Dr Richard Berman, Consultant Physician, owns more than 25% of the shares in this company) provides the hospital with palliative care services, including 24/7 on-call provision and receives an annual fee of £20,000 for these services.

Cardiovascular Services Limited, in which Mr David Murray, Dr Jonathan Ghosh, Dr Ananth Krishnan, Mr Mark Welch and Mr Steven Richardson, Consultant Vascular Surgeons, who all own 19% of the shares each, provides the hospital with cardiovascular services and charges £450 per hour.

Heart Physiology Limited, in which Dr David Fox, Consultant Cardiologist, Dr Ben Brown, Consultant Cardiologist, and Keith Peace, Bank Physiologist, each own a third of the business provides cardiac physiology services at a fee per case of £300.

Simply Hear Limited, of which Lucy-Anne Hastings and Zoe Wyatt, Clinical Audiologist and Hearing Aid Dispensers, are 50% owners, provides hearing tests and assessments at the hospital and are paid approximately £5,800 per month for this service.

Dr Simon Campbell, Consultant Gastroenterologist, provides the hospital with advice relating to accreditation with JAG (Joint Advisory Group on GI Endoscopy) and receives a quarterly fee of £2,500 for this service.

Clinical Chair

Mr Mohammed Saeed, Consultant Colorectal and General Surgeon, is the Clinical Chair of the hospital. Mr Mohammed Saeed's role includes chairing hospital Clinical Governance Committee meetings and attending the hospital's Senior Management Team meetings. Mr Mohammed Saeed is paid £18,000 per year for these services. In addition, the Clinical Chair will also attend national Clinical Chair meetings, generally in London, for which we reimburse their reasonable travel and attendance expenses.
